### How does Building Learning Power work?

Building Learning Power helps children to;

- Feel confident in their learning ability- learn faster, learn better
- Develop resilience
- Think harder and challenge themselves more
- Find learning more enjoyable
- Enjoy being curious and asking questions
- Understand our voice and opinions are valued when we are respectful to each other
- Do better in tests and examinations
- Become life-long learners
- Be the person they aspire to be
- BE HAPPY

An ELSA is a warm, caring person who wants to help your child feel happy in school and help them reach their potential educationally. Their aim is to remove the barriers to learning and to have happy children in school and at home. ELSAs are trained and regularly supervised by the Educational Psychologists from the Local Authority. Miss Coombes is our ELSA.
